<u>Wed 8th Nov:</u> Blessed John Duns Scotus – Memorial (c. 1265-1308) born in Duns in Berwickshire and joined the Franciscan Friars Minor. Sent to study at Oxford and to teach at the University of Paris. He taught the doctrine of the Immaculate Conception of Mary.

Thurs 9 Nov: Feast of the Dedication of the Lateran Basilica. After the Emperor

Constantine granted the freedom of worship to the Catholic Church in 313, a church was built beside the palace of the Laterani family and consecrated in 324. It is the cathedral of the diocese of Rome.

Fri 10 Nov: Saint Leo The Great – Memorial.

(c.390-461) from a prominent Roman family and was eminent as a pope. In 452 he met Attila the Hun and persuaded him to abandon the invasion of the Italian peninsula. One of the great Doctors of the Church.
