Wed 21 Feb: **Saint Peter Damian** (1007-1072) was a teacher, then a hermit. He supported the Pope by his writings and his strenuous efforts to instill discipline in church life. He became Cardinal Bishop of Ostia. On his death he was at once venerated as a saint.

Thurs 22 Feb: **Chair of Saint Peter** – Feast which emphasizes the teaching authority of the Pope. The chair or cathedra is the place from where each bishop teaches his people, and gives us the word "cathedral". The Pope presides over the whole Church and teaches us the Faith which unites us with each other.

Genesis 9:8-15

God spoke to Noah and his sons, 'See, I establish my Covenant with you, and with your descendants after you; also with every living creature to be found with you, birds, cattle and every wild beast with you: everything that came out of the ark, everything that lives on the earth. Christ himself, innocent though he was, died once for sins, died for the guilty, to lead us to God. In the body he was put to death, in the spirit he was raised to life, and, in the spirit, he went to preach to the spirits in prison. Now it was long ago, when Noah was still building that ark which saved only a small group of eight people 'by water', and when God was still waiting patiently, that these spirits refused to believe. That water is a type of the baptism which saves you now, and which is not the washing off of physical dirt but a pledge made to God from a good conscience, through the resurrection of Jesus Christ, who has entered heaven and is at God's right hand, now that he has made the angels and Dominations and Powers his subjects.
