Liturgical Calendar

Mon 29 April: Feast of Saint Catherine of

Siena (1347-1380) While still young she had mystical experiences in prayer which led her to receiving the stigmata. Declared a Doctor of the Church in 1970.

Tues 30 April: Opt. Mem. of Saint Pius V (1504-1572). Pope Pius V pulled the Church out of the chaos caused by the Reformation, through the measures introduced after the Council of Trent.

Wed 1 May: Opt. Mem. of Saint Joseph the Worker instituted by Pope Pius XII in 1955 to state clearly that the Church was also interested in the rights and dignity of workers.

<u>Thurs 2 May:</u> Memorial of **St Athanasius**, Bishop of Alexandria (Egypt)

Fri 3 May: Feast of St Philip and St James two of the twelve Apostles. St Philip spread the Faith in Greece and Turkey (martyred in AD80). St James (the Lesser) was bishop of Jerusalem and martyred in AD 62
