Liturgical Calendar

Mon 24 June: Solemnity - **The Nativity of St**

John The Baptist the son of Zachary and Elizabeth, lived a life of austerity and penance in the desert, proclaiming a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins: he prepared his people to receive the Lord. Jesus said of him: "of all the children born to women, there is no one greater than John".

Tues 25 June: **Saint Luan** (Moluag) was a monk of Bangor in Ireland and a contemporary of St Columba. He preached to the Picts on Lismore and in Ross-shire: built many churches and monasteries. He died in 592.

Thurs 27 June: **St Cyril of Alexandria** (376-444). Doctor of the Church.

Fri 28 June: Memorial - **St Iranaeus** (130-200), came from Turkey and whose bishop was one of the last to have known St John, the longest surviving Apostle. He emphasized the unbroken line of bishops since the Apostles as a guarantee of orthodox teaching. Tradition holds he died a martyr. Doctor of the Church.
