Liturgical Calendar

Mon 12 Aug: St Blaen, Bishop, was born in Ireland, settled in mainland Scotland, where he built a monastery on what would become the site of a cathedral begun by David I, in the place which would bear his name – Dunblane. He died in 590.

Tues 13 Aug: St. Pontian and St. Hippolytus

Wed 14 Aug: St Maximilian Mary Kolbe Memorial. In 1941 he was interred in Auschwitz. When one prisoner escaped, the authorities (to deter further attempts) decided to starve ten others to death. One of those chosen implored to be exempt because he had a wife and children, and Maximilian volunteered to be his substitute. Two weeks later, nine had died but Maximilian was still alive, so a guard was ordered to give him a lethal injection.

Thurs 15 Aug: The Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary – Holy Day of Obligation (also the Anniversary of the Episcopal Ordination of Bishop Hugh Gilbert in 2011).

Fri 16 Aug: St Stephen of Hungary (975-1038)
