Liturgical Calendar

Tues 22 Oct: **St John Paul II**, (1920-2005) opt. Mem. Born in Wadiwice, Poland, eleted pope in 1978, the first non-Italian pope for 450 years. He is said to have made more than 100 'apostolic vists' and notably several visits to Poland, influencing the end of Communist rule.

Wed 23 Oct: St John of Capistrano (1386-

1456), opt. Mem. He studied civil and canon law and in 1416 became a Franciscan. He was employed by several popes; he preached against heretics and even led Christian troops into battle against the Muslim Ottomans. He died of bubonic plague.

Thurs 24 Oct: St Anthony Mary Claret (1807-

1870), opt. Mem. A Catalan, who though ordained, was given permission and became a wandering preacher in Spain. He founded an order that became known as the 'Claretians'. He spent 10 years in Cuba as Archbishop of Santiago serving the poor.
