GOSPEL REFLECTION Luke 3:15-16, 21-22

Today is an opportunity for all of us to reflect on our own baptism. It is not something which happened a long time ago and which 'made' us Catholics. It is not just a ceremony lasting a few minutes which produces magical effects. Rather, it is the beginning of a lifelong journey. It is the beginning of a process of growing into the Body of Christ as one of its members.

Our baptism is essentially a community experience; it is not just a private or a family event, although in the way it was "celebrated" it may have looked like that. It involves active participation in the life of the Church and not just passive membership. Perhaps we could slightly alter the words of the American president, John F. Kennedy, in his inaugural address and 'Ask not what the Church can do for you, but what you can do for the Church'

Liturgical Calendar

Mon 13 Jan: Feast of **St Kentigern** (508-603) His mother, St Enoch, was a Lothian princess who became pregnant because she was raped. Her father had her cast off into the Fith of Forth in a coracle. She landed on the opposite shore at St Serf's monastic school at Culross. It was he who named him Mungo. He became the first Bishop of Glasgow.

Tues 14 Jan: Opt. Memorial of St Hilary (c. 310-397) was born in Poitiers and became bishop of that city in 350. He was a very active opponent of the Arian heresy, and was exiled for four years by the Emperor Constantine for this reason. He wrote his Treatise on the Trinity, and many other works during his exile.

Fri 17 Jan: Memorial - St Anthony the Abbot (251-356) known as the "Father of Monasticism". As a teenager gave up all his possessions when his parents died and went to live as a hermit in the Egyptian desert. He helped St Athanasius, Bishop of Alexandria, in opposing the Arian heresy.
