ST PIUS OF PIETRELCINA

He was born in 1887 of humble village parents, the future *Padre Pio* became a Capuchin Franciscan novice at 15 and an ordained priest in 1910. His health was not robust but he already had a reputation as a holy person, with simple but constant praying, and his Masses involved much contemplative prayer. One day in 1918, as he prayed before a crucifix after Mass, he received the stigmata (the marks in his own body of the marks of the Passion of Jesus). He ate little, arose daily at 2:30am and, apart from Mass, his daily occupation was to celebrate the sacrament of reconciliation with the many people who wished to confess to him. The monastery of San Giovanni Rotondo, near Foggia in the south of Italy, was a place of pilgrimage in Padre Pio's lifetime, it remains so today, with many thousands of visitors annually.

CAMPAIGN TO BOYCOTT TRADE WITH ISRAELI SETTLEMENTS

Catholic charity Justice & Peace Scotland (JPS) has joined more than 80 civil society organisations worldwide as part of the campaign. Israel's settlements in Palestine are seen as illegal under international law, but Israeli ministers dispute this. Under international law, no occupying power can transfer members of its own civilian population into the territory it occupies, as enshrined in the Fourth Geneva Convention.

The campaign calls for a ban on all trade, as well as identifying any other financial support which may benefit illegal settlements, as well as customs agencies being held responsible for determining the origins of Israeli goods.

ST NINIAN DECLARATION TO 'DEEPEN FRIENDSHIP'

A historic declaration of friendship between the Scottish Episcopal Church (a member of the Anglican Communion) and the Catholic Church in Scotland, was signed on 16 September by Archbishop Leo Cushley (St Andrews & Edinburgh) on behalf of the Bishops' Conference of Scotland, and counter-signed by the Most Rev. Mark Strange, Bishop of Moray, Ross and Caithness and Primus of the Scottish Episcopal Church.

"The St Ninian Declaration" affirms the possibilities for working more closely together while acknowledging that there are distinct differences between the two churches, and it encourages joint worship and prayer, shared preparation for baptism and confirmation, common study of faith, co-operation in lay and ordained ministry, and shared witness to the world.

The Saint Ninian Declaration follows the **Saint Andrew Declaration** of 2021 between the Scottish Episcopal Church and the Church of Scotland, and the **Saint Margaret Declaration** of 2022, a declaration of friendship between the Conference of Bishops of the Catholic Church in Scotland and the Church of Scotland.
