St Joseph the Worker

St Joseph the worker is a feast instituted by Pope Pius XII in 1955 to state clearly that the Church was also interested in the rights and dignity of the workers. The image of St Joseph, the carpenter, earning his daily living by the work of his own hands is held up to emphasise the necessity of work, the part it plays in the self-esteem of many, and the contribution made to society by so many skills and talents. It is a day for highlighting the social encyclicals of popes.

It complements, rather than replaces, traditional offertory collections and is particularly beneficial for those who no longer carry cash.

Pope: As a pastor, I cannot be in favour of war; too many innocents have died

Following the conclusion of his Apostolic Journey to Africa, Pope Leo XIV reflected on his mission during the return flight from Malabo to Rome. Speaking as Pastor and Bishop of Rome, he emphasized that such journeys are meant to encounter, accompany and better understand the People of God. He called for a renewed culture of peace, warning against the instinct to respond to conflict with violence and war, especially as so many innocent lives have been lost. Recalling in particular the suffering of children in conflicts in Iran and Lebanon, the Pope reiterated his firm opposition to war, condemned the death penalty, and urged all nations to uphold and respect international law while continuing to proclaim the Gospel to all peoples.
