a ruined 17th century church set within a
graveyard which was still in use into the
20th century. (*Clachan*, meaning stones, is
the Gaelic word for a graveyard). The
church is built on the site of an earlier

church, possibly 10th century, which was dedicated to Saint Bean and
known as Kilbeathan.

Our Lady of Sorrows

The feast of Our Lady of Sorrows is liturgically celebrated on 15th
September. Traditionally, the Seven Sorrows are: The Prophecy of
Simeon / The Flight into Egypt / The Loss of the Child Jesus / Meeting
Jesus carrying the Cross / The Crucifixion of Jesus / The Descent of Jesus
from the Cross / The Burial of Jesus.

Related to this devotion is the *Stabat Mater*, a hymn composed in honour
of the sufferings of Mary during the Crucifixion.
